

POP UP CARD INSTRUCTIONS

1. Fold the BASE in half along the short side and unfold again, the dotted line should follow the fold and the image should be on the inside
2. Following the solid lines cut out:
FLOOR LEVEL
NORTH & EAST WALLS (you can make a rough cut out of these two and
SOUTH & WEST WALLS trim to the solid line after you glue each of them)
AISLE
AISLE ROOF
AISLE ROOF SUPPORT
3. Fold the NORTH & EAST WALLS and SOUTH & WEST WALLS away from you along the long dotted line and glue each half together. Trim them back to the solid lines.
4. Fold FLAP **A** and FLAP **B** of the FLOOR LEVEL towards you. Fold NORTH & EAST WALLS to make an L shape and glue FLAP **A** and FLAP **B** to the indicated areas.
5. Fold SOUTH & WEST WALLS to make an L shape and glue FLAP **C** and FLAP **B** to the indicated areas to make a box on top of the FLOOR LEVEL. Only two sides of the box will be attached to the FLOOR LEVEL.
6. Glue the FLOOR LEVEL together with the whole box to the BASE along the solid white lines. Make sure that the TOP CORNER of the FLOOR LEVEL and the BASE match. When they do match the front of the aisle visible on the SOUTH & WEST WALLS should be in front of the white square on the BASE. After the glue has dried fold and unfold the BASE.
7. Fold the dotted lines of the AISLE away from you, glue FLAP **G** to the other end to make a box and flatten down so that FLAP **E** and FLAP **F** overlap.
8. Follow the folding instructions on the AISLE ROOF SUPPORT and glue FLAP **1** and FLAP **4** to the opposing tall ends of the AISLE box. The long dotted line of the AISLE ROOF SUPPORT should align with the two tips of the AISLE.
9. Fold the AISLE ROOF away from you along the dotted line and glue one slope to FLAP **2** and the other to FLAP **3**. The grassy slope should be on top of the grassy wall of the AISLE. The edges of the AISLE ROOF should cover the short dotted lines of the AISLE ROOF SUPPORT.
10. Keeping the AISLE folded, glue FLAP **F** on the indicated area to the BASE and then put glue on FLAP **E**. Fold the BASE along its crease, apply pressure over the area where FLAP **E** is.
11. Unfold the BASE carefully and make a small adjustment on the AISLE ROOF so that it sits well on top of the AISLE.
12. You can now fold and unfold the card and the model will pop-up. If you want to keep the card open for display you can tuck the tip of the aisle on SOUTH & WEST WALLS under the AISLE ROOF to make the model more stable.

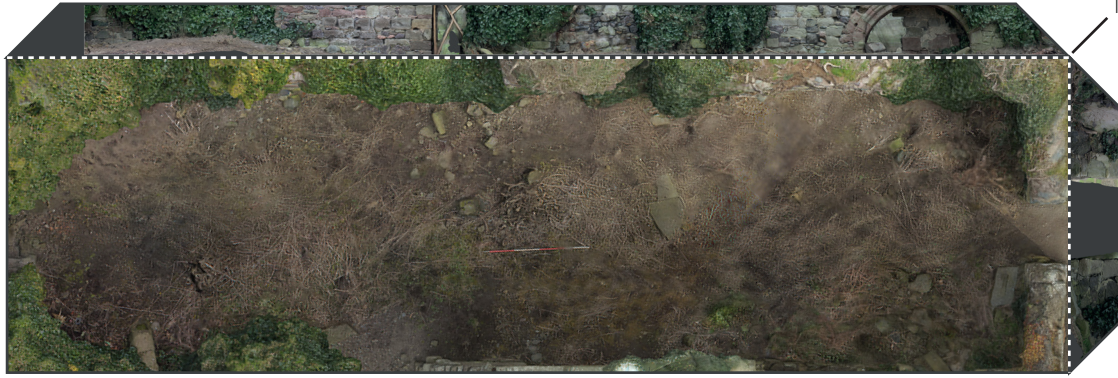

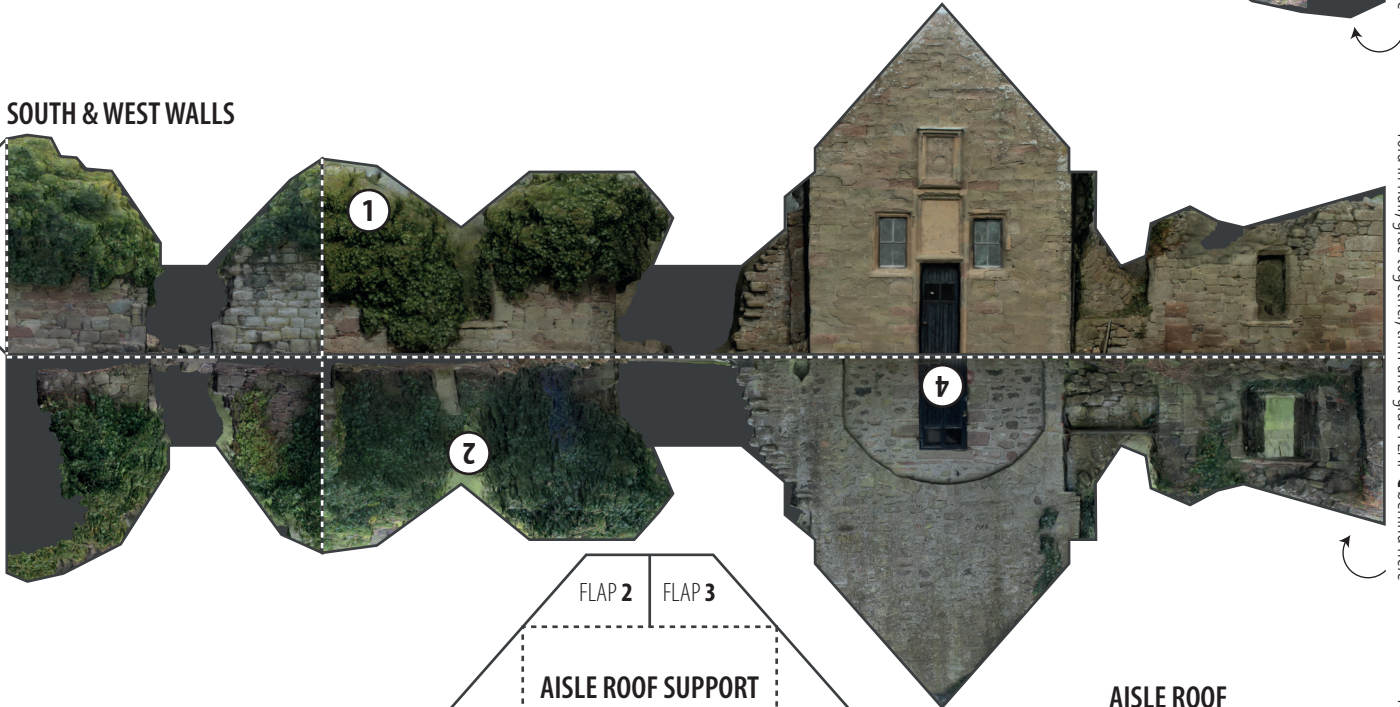

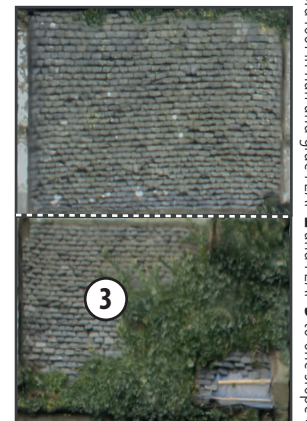

KINFAUNS PARISH CHURCH

With the help of a grant from Historic Scotland, Tay Landscape Partnership are consolidating and repairing this historic churchyard for the enjoyment of many generations to come.

1. The church is around 600 years old, built in the early 15th century and dedicated to Saint Ninian. It replaced an earlier chapel founded in the 12–14th centuries.
2. Over time, the church was remodelled with some interesting details; such as the re-use of medieval grave slabs to create window frames.
3. The roofed building attached was built in the 16th century. It may have been used initially by the local laird during services to provide privacy; a 'laird's loft'. It later became a burial aisle for John Charteris and his wife Janet Chisholm.
4. In 1878, ten years after a new church had been built to the west, the Charteris aisle was reused by the Gray family. Their plaques are well preserved inside and Lady Charteris is still interred in the underground vault.
